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
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

The Gothic City Hall with its Belfry is the market square's eyecatcher. The oldest part, the 14th-century Cloth Hall, houses the MOU: a museum about the city's history, with a rich collection of tapestries and a unique assortment of gold- and silversmith work.

TAPESTRIES

For centuries, Oudenaarde was well-known for its tapestries.
Especially the verdures tapestries – derived from the French 'vert', translated as 'green' – with beautiful landscapes, proved popular. One of the latest acquisitions, from a Sotheby auction in New York, is a 16th-century tapestry that was once gifted to Alexander Farnese. Elsewhere in the museum, there

are more than 15 original tapestries dating back to the 16th and 17th centuries. Up in the attic, under the rafters, you will find one of the largest silver collections in Flanders. The one entitled De Boever-Alligoridès is rich and varied and represents the different highlights and regions of European silversmithing. It also offers a beautiful, and almost complete, overview



of Oudenaarde's silver during the Ancien Régime.

SLEEPING HANSKE

Surprisingly perhaps, but on this market square in Oudenaarde, you can find mermaids in the company of angels and hunters. How to make sense of this is up to each individual admirer of the City Hall, which forms one whole with the (14th-century) Cloth Hall and the (16th-century) Belfry. It is no coincidence that the Belfry is on the Unesco World Heritage List. Even Victor Hugo never tired of the mysteries and legends incorporated in the facades: "In this fantastic building, every detail is worth careful scrutiny". We

let you in on one mystery now: the bronze statue on the spire shows Hanske de Krijger. Legend has it he was a watchman at the city gate. He was told to open the gate for Emperor Charles V, but Hanske fell asleep before Charles V arrived and so the emperor was refused entry to Oudenaarde. Charles V advised the people of Oudenaarde to buy a pair of spectacles for their city watchman. That is how to this day, a set of spectacles is displayed on the city's coat of arms.

The museum is open every day except Monday.

IN THE WHEEL

Drama and euphoria; winning and losing; bad luck and invincibility. These are all the ingredients of Flanders' Finest. At the Centre's exhibition, you can relive all this in an interactive way. With a sports commentator on the motorbike in your ear, you will learn even more. All this while the little ones can enjoy a children's trail.

ON THE PEDALS

Would you rather discover first-hand how it feels to negotiate the legendary climbs and pesky cobblestones? The Centre is the perfect place to set off from. It offers racing bike rental, a wide range of (audio) routes, changing rooms and showers. In short, everything you need to have a go yourself.





PELOTON CAFÉ

To avoid cramps, a faint spell or other discomforts, regular replenishments are indispensable. Fancy a hearty meal before you set off? A delicious thirst-quencher afterwards? Or do you just prefer to watch the race from the comfort of the café? The Peloton Café is happy to serve you, whether you're the leader or a domestique.

LIEDTS PARK

When the sun puts in an appearance, the residents of Oudenaarde head for Liedts Park in their droves. This 19th-century castle garden is now a city park with winding paths, romantic bridges and ponds with water features.

A GARDEN AS A HOBBY

Like many historical cities, Oudenaarde was surrounded by water and ramparts. Charles Liedts, a prominent statesman with a passion for gardening, decided to buy them and create an English-style landscaped park around 1860. His son Amedée converted his father's cottage into a castle and added his initials to the window panes.

A CASTLE AS A GIFT

When Amedée died childless in 1907, he donated the Liedts Castle with the garden, library and art collections to the city, on condition that the boundaries of the park would never change. The donated works of art form part of today's 'MOU Museum collection'

GREEN LUNG

Liedts Park was opened to visitors after the Second World War. Today, it is a green lung in the heart of the city, where strolling along the winding paths is simply delightful. In 2012, part of the historical city wall on the edge of the park was restored. Liedts Park is freely accessible from sunrise to sunset.



Ename once boasted a fortress that was designed to protect the borders of the German empire. Later, a mighty abbey arose along the Scheldt. The village still bears witness to that eventful past.

PAM ENAME

In Ename, the entire village breathes history. An archaeological museum is nestled in the shadows of the Church of St Laurence, In this Pam Fname Museum, you can learn about the history of a small community on the Scheldt, which - for a brief spell - played a crucial role in the creation of Europe and, for centuries, lived to the rhythm of the abbey. The church itself is also worth a visit. In this unique monument, with remnants of original Byzantine-inspired wall paintings.

HERITAGE SITE

In the archaeological park along the Scheldt, you walk along the foundations of the Benedictine abbey that determined life in Ename from 1063 to 1795. In the t'Ename Forest, too, there is still evidence of this past.

THE BEAUCARNE HOUSE

An inconspicuous façade in the centre of Ename conceals a remarkable heritage gem. Huis Beaucarne has been owned by the same prominent family for over 250 years. Together with the impressive garden, the building forms a unique document of its time, full of antiques and curiosities.



T'ENAME FOREST

Even in the Middle Ages, the t'Ename Forest on the green slopes of the Flemish Ardennes was intimately linked to the port town of Ename and the abbey. Some of it is a nature reserve, but the paths are great for hiking. An educational trail, named after botanist Mariette Thielemans, introduces you to the rich local fauna and flora. In 2002, the t'Ename Forest received the Flemish Monument Prize: the first time this prize was awarded to a landscape.

MULLEM

The castle village of Mullem is blessed with a generous dose of authentic charm. The early medieval village centre with its typical ochre-hued houses has remained unspoilt for centuries and is, in fact, recognised as protected heritage.

OCHRE-COLOURED HOUSES

Time has no hold over Mullem. The village centre under the lime trees is listed and consists of a church, a presbytery, a school building, a convent and a farmstead. The ochre colour of most of the houses is not accidental. In the days when noblemen held sway here, yellow ochre was the colour of the coat of arms of the local nobility.

CASTLE VILLAGE

At the origin of Mullem was a 12th-century walled fortress on the spot where the 'Klein Kasteeltje' (Little Castle) stands today. Just outside the village, you pass the castle of the Lords of Ast. The domain belongs to the De Gerlache family of nobility, who wrote history with a series of South Pole expeditions.

BATTLE OF OUDENAARDE

In 1708, the Battle of Oudenaarde took place in the farmland around Mullem, Several major powers had joined forces against France, which laid claim to the Spanish throne. Both armies, together accounting for 180,000 soldiers, stood face to face, with heavy losses suffered on both sides. In the end, Louis XIV's French army bit the dust.

MONU-MENTAL

The 100+ historical buildings and monuments in Oudenaarde will keep you busy for a while. Even the city's beating shopping heart breathes the medieval atmosphere. In and around Broodstraat, Nederstraat, Einestraat and Hoogstraat, more than 300 specialist shops guarantee a monumental welcome.









THE TALLEST

1 WALBURGA'S CHURCH

The 88-metre-tall spire of St Walburga's Church can be seen for miles around. Strangely enough, this

fine piece of history is a story of two halves. Of the 12th-century, early Gothic church, only the chancel section in Tournai limestone was preserved. The rest of the lower church is an exquisite example of 15th-century Brabant Gothic.

THE RICHEST 2 OUR LADY'S CHURCH

Our Lady's Church of Pamele shines in all its glory on the banks of the Scheldt. Built in the 13th century by Arnulf

IV, baron of Pamele, it was much more opulent than St Walburga's Church. This church, where Margaret of Parma was christened, is a fine piece of Schelde Gothic architecture, with a striking mix of Romanesque and Gothic features thrown in.

3 ABBEY MAAGDENDALE

Built in 1233 by the Cistercians, the Maagdendale Abbey was for centuries one of the most prominent

women's abbeys in Flanders. Even though the 13th-century abbey church immediately catches the eye, the red sandstone façade of the abbess's house from 1663 is also a delight. Today, the abbey accommodates the art academy and the city archives.

4 OUR LADY'S HOSPITAL

Our Lady's Hospital was first situated outside the city gates and was a place of refuge for pilgrims. In 1382, it

moved to the city centre as a shelter for the poor and sick. The Bishop's Quarter the reception area for high-ranking guests with a beautiful Louis XVI room and Oudenaarde tapestries.

Emperor Charles V not only had a thing for tapestries, but also for the beautiful Johanna van der Gheynst, a simple chambermaid from Oudenaarde. They had a daughter, who, as Margaret of Parma, would rule over the Habsburg Netherlands.

FLAMES OF PASSION

It doesn't take much to get Charles V's head and heart racing. That's exactly what happened in 1521, when Charles V was staying with Governor Karel de Lalaing in Oudenaarde. A furtive glance of Johanna van der Gheynst, one of the chambermaids in the castle, was all it took for Cupid to strike. It was the start of a short affair. but one with major consequences.

De Lalaing House, where Margaret of Parma was presumably born, is still a gem along the Scheldt.

FLESH AND BLOOD

Nine months later, Johanna gave birth in the Pamele district. Her daughter was christened in Our Lady's Church of Pamele as Margaret. Although Charles V must have been aware of this, it took him seven years to acknowledge Margaret as his own flesh and blood. She was soon paired with a papal relative. Her second marriage to Ottavio Farnese, Duke of Parma, earned her the name with which she would write history.

GOVERNESS

Margaret, daughter of a chambermaid, became Governess of the Netherlands in 1559. Unfortunately, she did not succeed in curbing the slumbering religious disputes. In 1567, the Duke of Alva brought the situation under control, using a heavy hand. Embittered, Margaret resigned and moved in with her son Alexander Farnese in Italy. She dies a lonely death in Ortona in 1586. Her grave can still be visited in the San Sisto Church in Piacenza.





A world-class painter whose work can be admired in the most prestigious museums: that is Adriaen Brouwer. The chronicler of everyday life was born in Oudenaarde four centuries ago, something which we still cherish with much pride.

COLOURFUL SCENES

Adriaen Brouwer was the son of an Oudenaarde tapestry weaver. At a young age, his father took him to Haarlem and Amsterdam, where he came into contact with the Northern Dutch masters of his time. Later, Brouwer moved to Antwerp, where he made a name for himself with his colourful pub scenes and small-scale landscapes.



TOP PHOTOGRAPHER


Brouwer had the talent of a top photographer. He was a master at painting emotions and moods and a genius at capturing the right moment. His exceptional gift did not go unnoticed, Both Rubens and Rembrandt were fans of the way in which Brouwer captured the ordinariness of man.

UNIQUE EXPO

In 1638, Brouwer died as quickly as he lived. Although the painter lived not much beyond thirty, his legacy leaves an indelible impression. In 2018, the MOU paid tribute to the man with a unique retrospective. Never before have so many of his works been on display at the same time. Welcome home. Adriaen Brouwer!

A remarkable episode in Oudenaarde's history came to pass on the other side of the globe. In the Mexican town of Tacámbaro, 250 fellow citizens were killed in an attempt to protect Empress Charlotte of Belgium.

ONE THOUSAND VOLUNTEERS

There's every chance that Charlotte of Belgium never set foot in Oudenaarde. Yet the daughter of king Leopold I is responsible for a bloody chapter in the city's history. At the request of her husband, Emperor Maximilian of Mexico, Oudenaarde gathered an army to protect his wife from the republican rebels. The troops assembled in the Pamele District on the banks of the Scheldt, the officers in the Maagdendale Abbey and the volunteers in the Jesuit monastery. In 1865 they set sail, all one thousand of them, heading for Mexico.

Charlotte is the subject of Adiós mamá Carlotta. a satirical song that is still sung in Mexico.

UNPRECEDENTED STRENGTH


In the Mexican city of Tacámbaro, the imperial troops came up against an unexpected military strength. The Belgians held out for five hours but eventually surrendered. The legion lost a quarter of its troops. Charlotte fled back to Europe. where she gently slipped into insanity. A vear later, her husband Maximilian was defeated and sentenced to death.

GRIEVING WOMAN

The monument on Tacambaro Square, designed by Willem Geefs in 1867, pays tribute to the Oudenaarde volunteers. who lost their lives in the battle of the same name. On the square, a column also commemorates the Battle of the Scheldt in 1918, when American soldiers crossed the river.

Flanders' Finest

On that particular Sunday, one white chalk line in Oudenaarde is the only goal of a hundred or so athletes, surrounded by thousands of reporters and spectators, and hundreds of thousands of nail-biting TV viewers at home.

That one weekend a year, the Tour of Flanders washes over the city like a tidal wave. On the Saturday, tens of thousands of cyclists from home and abroad ride their own Tour in the 'We Ride Flanders' cycling event, and defy the legendary climbs and cobbled streets just like their idols. On the Sunday, the road is cleared for the pros and

a new winner is added to the list of honour with mythical names like De Kannibaal (The Cannibal), De Leeuw van Vlaanderen (The Lion of Flanders) and Tornado Tom.

RETRO TOUR OF FLANDERS

Once upon a time, riders rode uphill without checking their wattage meters. They fought the elements on their steel bicycles in their knitted jerseys. Staying in the saddle on the slippery cobbles was their sole aim. At that time, there was no question of an earpiece with a team leader in it. This is how archetypal countrymen like Briek Schotte and Arthur Decabooter came into being.


BIKE ROUTES







CNUDDE BRUIN

In Eine, Lieven, Steven and Piet Cnudde fire up the kettles for their Oudenaarde Brown a few times a year. They themselves call it 'Kerkhofbier' (Kerkhof means cemetery), because the water laver they use for brewing their beer is close to the cemetery. The taste is a bit sour, like a traditional Old Brown.

LIEFMANS GOUDENBAND

Liefmans Goudenband, an award-winning, red-brown beer is brewed in open vats and matured in the Liefmans Brewery cellars. Like wine, it gets better with age. The bottle has a champagne cork; perfect for a smashing entrance.





NONNIVERSAIRE

Sam Vanderstraeten of brewery HopSaSam is not afraid of an experiment. In his Ename courtyard garden, he brings his recipes to life. His Nonniversaire, a digestif beer with champagne yeast and matured in calvados barrels, has won four prizes so far.







With a head of foam

Oudenaarde is pre-eminently the city of brown beer.

The tradition of brewing beer goes back to the distant

Middle Ages. Oudenaarde old brown owes its reputation to
the quality of the groundwater, which is rich in iron and calcium.

FAMILY AFFAIR

The story of Brewery Roman starts in 1545. Joos Roman owned a tavern in Mater called De Clocke, with an inn, a farm, a mill, a malt house and, of course, a brewery. Beer brewing gradually became the family's main activity.

With brothers Carlo and Lode Roman, the family business is now in its 14th generation.

OLD BROWN 2.0

Unlike the current variety,

Oudenaarde old brown used to be rather sour. After the Second World

War, most Oudenaarde brewers abandoned the traditional brewing method.

Mixed fermentation made way for either top or bottom fermentation. The brown colour of the beers remained, but the sour notes disappeared.

MADAME ROSE

Although beer is considered a man's drink, women have played an important role in the history of brewing. The living proof is Rosa Merckx, Belgium's first female brewmaster.

FROM BALLET TO BEER

Rosa Blancquaert-Merckx began her career as a ballet dancer. In 1946 she became secretary at the Liefmans Brewery. There she worked her way up to brewmaster. For more than 40 years, she was in charge of the brewing process. Today, Madame Rose still lives in a villa on the brewery's compound.

OPEN FERMENTATION

Brewery Liefmans' history goes back to 1679. The beer owes its characteristic taste to mixed fermentation in open vats. This is enriched with yeasts

from the ambient air. When the brewery Duvel Moortgat took over in 2008, the plan to relocate the brewery was quickly dropped. It proved impossible to equal the taste elsewhere.

SHOWPIECES

Liefmans introduced several beer brands onto the market, many of which have disappeared in the meantime. The showpieces
