WHERE SHOULD YOU BE? FROM MARKET SQUARE TO PUBLIC VILLAGE

It is not only the riders that bring the race to life, but also the crowds. The Tour of Flanders is set to once again captivate as a vibrant celebration, and this year's event promises to be no exception. But where should you be for all the spectacle?

As you move between the **Market Square** and the **arrival zone**, you'll have multiple opportunities to see the riders in action.

The women's team presentation takes place on the Market Square at 11:40 am, followed by the start of their race at 1:10 pm.

The lively **public village**, conveniently situated next to the finish line, will open its doors at 1 pm. As usual, the area welcomes you with the big screen, food and drink stands, entertainment and, above all, a vibrant atmosphere. Be sure to stick around until 6 pm to cheer on the winners during the podium ceremony.

In the **youth zone** located in Minderbroedersstraat and accessible via the public village, you can follow the race live on big screen.

Want to continue celebrating after the race?
The local pubs in Oudenaarde warmly welcome you and keep you entertained until the early hours.

How to get to Oudenaarde during the weekend of the Tour of Flanders?


BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

On Sunday, you can travel to and from Oudenaarde with the **free shuttle service D** from De Lijn*. From the public parking zone Bruwaan, you can take this shuttle bus to and from Oudenaarde station and the arrival zone.

- » 10 am to 1:15 pm Last outward journey from Parking zone Bruwaan (D1)
- 6:00 pm to 8 pm Last return journey from Arrival zone (D3)

The Kwaremont, Paterberg and Kruisberg hills can also be reached by free shuttle buses. For more information about routes and stops, go to delijn.be/rondevanvlaanderen.

The train service (NMBS**) offers **extra trains** from Ghent and Ronse. The most up-to-date info can be found at nmbs.be.



BY BIKE OR ON FOOT

If possible, we encourage you to come by bike or on foot. Then the race is within cycling and walking distance. **Free bicycle parking** is available in the centre of Oudenaarde and on the Koppenberg. You can also rent a Blue-bike for 2.50 euros at the station, or borrow an electric Hoppy shared bike. The app shows you where the free bicycles are located, and you can leave them at various points.

BY CAR


We do not recommend coming by car. On Saturday and Sunday, the Market Square is only accessible to pedestrians and cyclists. If you do come by car, you can **park it** in the public parking zone Bruwaan. Other car parks are not accessible.

Numerous traffic measures will be in place to ensure the Tour of Flanders weekend runs safely. Some streets will have no parking, one-way streets and/or traffic restrictions.


RIDE YOUR OWN RACE

Do you have what it takes to master the Oude Kwaremont and Koppenberg? Discover the wonderful Flemish Ardennes by following the signposted routes of Cycling in Flanders. Based on your skill level or time constraints you can decide which one to follow. It is safe to say that after riding these routes you will feel compelled to explore more of the Flemish Ardennes.

You have a choice of three loops with different gradients. The blue loop (80km) contains the Oude Kwaremont, Koppenberg and Taaienberg, while the yellow loop (102km) adds the Paddestraat and Volkegemberg. For the real cyclists there's the red loop (115km) which combines the above with Geraardsbergen and its mythical 'wall'.

RETRORONDE

Woolly jumpers, sausage-shaped helmets and unshaven legs. It will all happen during the two-day programme of the Retroronde on 14 and 15 June, organised by the Tour of Flanders Centre in cooperation with the city of Oudenaarde.

On Saturday afternoon you can test your legs with a retro ride to the Paterberg and Koppenberg. On Sunday there is the retro ride itself: you cycle a 40, 80, 120 or 150 (new!) kilometre route through the idyllic landscape of the Flemish Ardennes with retro-style entertainment. Also planned for that weekend: a flea market, vintage folk games, dance initiations and live music. Will you come and soak up the unique retro atmosphere? See you at Maagdendale Abbey.
